

(Plate 7, figs. 2, 3). A small species (length, 7681; breadth, 4toi.) of a bright red colour, allied to T. ccxcinea (Mich.) and T. excavata (VVasm.). Female. -- In general shape the body is narrower and more parallel-sided than it is in the allied species. (PI. 17, figs. 2, 3). The dorsum is deeply sculptured with comparatively strong marginal crenations, which become ir. ore feeble towards the posterior margin; the latter is fairly even in outline. The rostral projection resembles that of T. excavata, except that it is decidedly longer in the present species, and its lamellae do not form a continuous margin to the shoulders, as they do in T. coainca and other species of the genus. The raised central part of the dorsum is comparatively narrow; it is highest iu the middle line, and is margined for more than two-thirds of its length by two-paired chitinous ridges arranged in a line. The first of these is ribbon-like, followed by a second, which is broader and raised posteriorly. Following this last is an oval-raised part (supported on a crescentic ridge of chitin), separated by a depression from the central part of the back. The latter is coarsely areolated as indicated in the figure, and bears...
